General Medical Volunteer Questions:

Thank you for choosing to volunteer your medical skills for the 9 Health Fair. Before we can assign you to a station or screening we need to ask you some questions to make sure we place you in the best possible area for your skills.

What area of the 9 Health Fair would you like to volunteer in?

Have you volunteered at a 9 Health Fair in the past? If so when & what did you do.

Do you speak any languages fluently?

If so would you consider being an interpreter?

Medical Specific Questions:

What medical credentials do you hold?

Can your license or certification be verified through the state of Colorado?

Can you fax, email, bring or mail a copy of your license or certification to us, if needed?

If your license is not through the State of Colorado, what state are you licensed in?

If your medical professional does not require state licensing or certification, where did you attend school?(For Medical Assistants, phlebotomists & EMT-Basics with IV approval).

Can you provide proof that you completed the course?

If not are you currently a student? If so where do you attend?

Are you currently active in your field?

How long have you been in your medical career?

If you are an working as a Medical Assistant (MA), what are your current job duties?(some MA's only work in the office).

If you are currently inactive, how long have you been inactive or retired?

Specific Questions for Blood Draw / Phlebotomy:

Are you currently working in a medical profession where you perform blood draws or IV starts as a regular part of your job?

If so where do you work?

What would you estimate as the number of blood draws or IV starts you do on a monthly basis?

If you are currently not working, inactive or need more practice at blood draws, would you be able to attend a clinical on your own to get the required 25 successful blood draw or IV starts to qualify to perform blood draws for the 9 Health Fair?

All phlebotomy volunteers that have been inactive in drawing blood or doing IV starts for at least 6 months are strongly encouraged to attend a free 9 Health Fair Phlebotomy Familiarization (Refresher) Course. This course reviews steps for a safe, sterile technique, goes over 9HF protocol, standards & expectations, along with hands on use of 9HF/ Quest Diagnostics approved equipment. It is not a clinical to get live sticks. Update info on when & where courses will be held can be found at www.9healthfair.org

IV & Phlebotomy Students:

If you are a student wanting to do blood draws, these are the requirements to be able to do so at a 9 Health Fair site:

All students must be accompanied by an instructor. There is a strict student to instructor ratio that must be followed. Per 9 Health Fair protocols, it is 4-8 students per 1 instructor. However only 1 student can be doing a blood draw while the instructor supervises them. Some of the metro districts have gone to a stricter requirement ratio of 5 students to 1 instructor.

All students should sign up with their school, as well as on the website. Students must list their school's name & instructor's information on the website. Students must fill out the Phlebotomy Student Volunteer & Instructor Agreement. The form must be presented to the lab supervisor, the morning of the fair to participate.

Volunteer Coordinators should contact the school instructors to make sure the protocols, standards & requirements are known & followed.

Many metro area schools are part of the 9 Health Fair Phlebotomy Coalition. All schools that are part of the coalition are assigned to a specific metro area district. Please make sure if the student is part of a coalition school, they sign up for the assigned district.

Any student attending a 9 Health Fair without an instructor or without a signed agreement will not be allowed to do blood draws, and would be assigned to another station at the fair.

All students are highly encouraged to attend a 9 Health Fair Phlebotomy Refresher course. Some schools do make arrangements to have these for their students as well.

Medical Screener Questions:

What are your qualifications & experience for the screening you are volunteering to for?

How long have you been practicing in this field of medicine?

Have you done this screening at a prior 9 Health Fair?

Do you have a copy of or have you seen the current 9 Health Fair protocols & standards for Standard or Optional Screeners for your screening?

Do you have any questions regarding your screening?

Medical Screening Students:

All students doing standard or optional screenings must have an instructor present when doing the screening. Student-Instructor ratios will vary, depending on the actual screening. Please refer to the screening protocol in the Resource Guide, to find the correct ratio.

Students will need to provide school & instructor information when signing up.
All students need to adhere to 9 Health Fair protocols, standards & expectations.
